Programmes

We buy approximately 4m books a year across:

- Bookstart Baby (universal) / Bookstart SEN (around 1.3 million babies and toddlers receive Bookstart packs each year in England and Wales, which is around 95% of all children)
- Bookstart Treasure (universal)
- Bookstart Corner
- Time To Read (universal)
- Letterbox Club
- Bookbuzz
- School Library Pack / Special School Library Pack
- BookTrust Cymru programmes
- Dual Language titles





The Process

Three stage process:

- Find books! We do this through our deep knowledge of children's publishing and new developments; holding regular meetings with publishers, big and small; publisher 'call outs'
- Longlist in house
- Selection panel different for every programme and every year



Selection Panels

Selection panels are made up of:

- Librarians, teachers, booksellers, book bloggers and reviewers
- SEN specialists (for visually and hearing-impaired children)
- Child psychologists
- Foster carers, care leavers and virtual school heads
- Panel members are from across England, Wales and Northern Ireland; urban and rural; male and female and from different and diverse backgrounds and settings.



Criteria

For Baby and Treasure we are looking for books that:

- Are suitable for gifting when a baby is 6 8 weeks old but which can be read throughout the first year and meet our reading habit formation objective (for Baby)
- Appeal to children aged 3 4 years (for Treasure)
- Contain simple, accessible text in clear and legible fonts with good contrast; contain text with rhyme, rhythm and repetition; have themes that are accessible and inclusive and that
- Involve babies and children in the reading experience; encourage babies and children to make sounds and vocalise
- Have illustrations/photographs that are diverse and inclusive and reflect a diversity
 of racial and cultural backgrounds and abilities
- Families will enjoy and will hold up to multiple readings
- Reflect baby's/child's experiences and stimulate a child's imagination
- Please note that all books must be well produced and printed, meet the health and safety standards of the UK and Europe and have the CE quality mark. Board books must be safe and sturdy enough for purpose.




Other Considerations

- Less affluent + less engaged beneficiaries
- Adults and carers who can't read or don't read
- Adults and carers who were never read to and don't know how to share a book with a child
- Families for whom English is not their first language
- Trigger issues for vulnerable children (even for universal programmes)
- MUST BE A GOOD STORY!!




